Objective

Issues in Accounting and Reporting is a program targeted for accounting personnel with at least a basic understanding of college and university accounting. Discussion will be based upon fund accounting and will include issues and problems that commonly confront college and university accounting officers and acceptable accounting practices and standards for reporting. Examples, illustrations, and group discussion will highlight practical solutions. This workshop is tailored for GASB institutions. Upon completion of this course participants will be able to:

- Understand how operating issues affect the accounting environment.
- Understand how the various business office operations contribute to the information that is used to compile financial statements.
- Have an awareness of preferred industry accounting and reporting practices.
- Understand the format of university financial statements, including the cash flow statement.
- Prepare, understand and interpret the various financial statements (SNA, SRECNA, Statement of Activities, and Statement of Cash Flows).
- Understand and prepare MDA and Notes to Financial Statements

- Share insights about new accounting guidance on the horizon.
- Understand how Federal legislative issues may impact business operations.

No prerequisites or advanced preparation is necessary.

Presenter

Mary L. Fischer serves as a full professor in Accounting for the University of Texas at Tyler's College of Business and Technology. Dr. Fischer has published over fifty research papers regarding cash flow recognition, financial accounting, accounting education, auditing and financial management of not-for-profit organizations and is a frequent local and national seminar speaker regarding FASB and GASB GAAP Updates. She produced a weekly accounting tutorial that is posted on the World Wide Web and is the co-author of an advanced accounting text published by Wiley Publication. Her research has appeared in *Research in Governmental and Nonprofit Accounting*, *Critical Perspectives on Accounting*, *Accounting Horizons*, *Journal of Accounting and Public Policy*, *Journal of Public Budgeting*, *Accounting & Financial Management*, *Internal Auditing*, *Oil, Gas & Energy Quarterly*, the *Journal of Accounting Education*, and the *Government Accounting Journal*, among other journals. She has presented papers at numerous conferences, including the American Accounting Association, Decision Science Institute and Association for Research on Nonprofit Organizations and Voluntary Action.

Dr. Fischer is the past president of Southwest Decision Science Institute, Southwest American Accounting Association, American Accounting Association Government and Nonprofit Section. She is also the past president of the Federation of Business Disciplines, an organization of business school faculty with over 5,000 members throughout the Southwestern United States. Dr. Fischer serves as an advisor to the Financial Accounting Standards Board, Government Accounting Standards Board, and an array of not-for-profit organizations nationwide.

Dr. Fischer was awarded the UT Tyler President's Scholarly Achievement. She was named the 2009 outstanding accounting educator by the East Texas Society of Certified Public Accountants as well as the Texas Society of Certified Public Accountants in 2002 and the Southwestern American Accounting Association in 2003. She was awarded the Daniel D. Robinson and the Professional Development and Scholarship awards by the National Association of College and University Business Officers for her outstanding contributions to the college and university national sector. She is a Certified Government Financial Manager and member of the East Texas Society of Certified Public Accountants.
